Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

I will make you a light to the nations. To the ends of the earth.

- The first reading from Isaiah is one of a set of songs which portray a "servant of the Lord," who was commissioned by God to bring salvation and whose suffering would redeem God's people.
- In today's passage the servant is called from the womb and commissioned to bring salvation to the nations.
- The Evangelists of the New Testament use the figure of the servant to explain the mission of Jesus.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

Grace and peace of God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

- The second reading begins Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, which will be read for the next several weeks.
- Paul describes himself as an Apostle, that is, "one who is sent."
- Together Paul and the Corinthians form a people "called," or ecclesia, which we translate as Church.

Gospel: John 1:29-34

Now I have seen for myself.

- The Gospel reading is part of a series of testimonies about the identity of Jesus.
- In today's reading, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God and as the Son of God, God's chosen one.
- The image of the lamb is rooted in the Passover, the deliverance from Egyptian slavery by God's saving power, during which the Jews sacrificed a lamb and put the blood on the door to commemorate the blood that saved their firstborn from the tenth plague.


Reading I Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 | **Psalm** 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10 | **Reading II** 1 Corinthians 1:1-3 | **Gospel** John 1:29-34

Question For The Children If someone were to ask you, "who is Jesus?" how would you answer?

Question For The Youth How are you able to see through all the busyness, the distractions, and the din of today's world to really see Christ as he makes himself present today? Where do you see him or experience his presence?

Question For The Adults In the gospel today, John tells us who Jesus is for him. If someone were to ask you, how would you answer this question: Who Jesus is for you?

Activity Of The Week Who is Jesus for you? Talk with family members about what each person believes about Jesus and what it means to follow him.



Saint Of The Week Francis de Sales

Francis was born France and studied at the University of Padua where he received his doctorate in law at the age of twenty-four. Despite the opposition of his father and an offer of a high government position, Francis chose to become a priest and was ordained in 1593. He was a very good preacher and spoke with clear, plain language. Many people came to hear him. He also loved the poor and rejected, and was committed to them throughout his life. Eventually, because of his holiness, he was made a bishop.

Francis was dedicated to people whose faith was weak and he worked to bring them back to the faith. How can you help the church welcome back those whose faith has grown cold?

Francis' message today:

Despite the clear danger to himself, Francis did not hesitate to volunteer to help bring back the "lost sheep" of Chablais. Each of us probably knows some lost sheep, family members or neighbors who no longer go to church. We can encourage them to return to the faith by prayer, our example, and a quiet word or two.


