INGREDIENTS

- 1 onion chopped fine
- 2 carrots chopped fine
- 2 cans of black beans, rinsed
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup breadcrumbs
- 2-3 cups oatmeal
- Burger seasoning
- Onion salt
- Pepper
- Non-stick Spray

TO MAKE

Pulse in food processor: onion, carrots, 2 cans of black beans and 2 eggs. Transfer to mixing bowl and add 1 cup breadcrumbs plus 2-3 cups oatmeal. Stir together and add burger seasoning, onion salt, and pepper to taste. Place in refrigerator 20 – 30 minutes to allow to set up. Next roll and flatten into burger patties. Set oven to 375°. Spray baking sheet with non-stick and place patties on baking sheet cooking for 10 minutes on each side. Add cheese in the last 2 minutes if you want any of them to be cheeseburgers. These can be refrigerated or frozen and reheated as needed.

\$1,500 TUITION GRANT

Families with children enrolled in non-Catholic schools may be eligible for a tuition grant if they enroll at Holy Trinity for the 2020-2021 school year. Tuition grants are available for each child (grades 1 – 7) for the first two years of enrollment.

Year one = \$1,000 discount on for each eligible student

NOTES FROM THE DIOCESE SEP 20 2020

Important Notes from the Bishop

The 2020 election season is well underway. Voting begins in early October and continues through Election Day, Nov. 3. This time offers an excellent opportunity to help parishioners learn and take to heart the moral and social teaching of the Church, and then to apply those principles in the voting booth and the public life of our society.

At the parish leadership check-in last week I referred to the Faithful Citizenship voters' voting guide composed by the four bishops of Iowa with the assistance of Tom Chapman of the Iowa Catholic Conference. Some of you may have already found it on our diocesan website: [2020 Election guide from the Iowa bishops](#). I've also attached it with this message, and you can also find [it here](#). A Spanish-language version will be available soon. I ask you to include this document in your parish bulletin and/or website and distribute the material in other ways as well.

This guide identifies the “what” of principles and issues that we are called to weigh as we form our consciences before voting. The “how” of engagement with our fellow Catholics and other citizens in this often contentious season is proposed in our Des Moines adaptation of the U.S. bishops' initiative to [Civilize It: Dignity Beyond the Debate](#), with an accent upon civility, clarity, and compassion.

A variety of helpful resources, including videos, bulletin announcements, lesson plans and prayers are available at www.faithfulcitizenship.org.

It hardly bears mentioning that the Catholic Church does not endorse or oppose any candidates or a particular political party. Advocacy for or endorsement of a particular candidate or party is not permitted and jeopardizes the tax-exempt status of our Catholic churches. No signs or materials supporting a particular party or candidate can be placed on or distributed within church/institutional property. It is not warranted for priests and deacons to say in the pulpit that voting for any one political candidate or party is a “sin,” since rarely if ever does someone comprehensively represent Catholic views on issues. To paraphrase Archbishop Jackels, it is a sin if we vote for someone *because* they're pro-abortion, pro-euthanasia, pro-death penalty, racist, or hostile toward immigrants and the poor.

NOTES ON THE MASS SEP 20 2020

HISTORICAL CULTURE CONTEXT

Employer or Patron

What is God like? The answer to this common question always reflects the culture of the questioner or the one who answers the question. Today's parable reports one of Jesus' many answers to this question. It should be no surprise that in this parable God behaves in accord with Middle Eastern values.

Limited Good

In general, Americans believe that "there is always more where this came from," whether it is oil, jobs, money, or whatever. This attitude makes it extremely difficult for Americans to understand concepts such as shortages, extinction, or anything similar.

Our Mediterranean ancestors in the faith believed "there is no more where this came from." Everything (jobs, wealth, honor, or whatever one could imagine) was limited in quantity and already distributed. The jobs at the vineyard were already filled. How dare any worker think there might be more jobs?

Moreover, to ask for a job is to deprive the employer of something he owns. This is shameful. Instead, workers have to be invited by the owner to work for him. The owner in this parable goes out four times in one day looking for workers to invite, and each time he hires everyone in sight. Such behavior by the owner and the potential workers is very honorable, because it respects the cultural idea that all goods—including jobs—are limited.



Patronage

In America, workers look for jobs, employers hire the best qualified workers, they agree on a wage and respect a practice called "seniority." None of this existed in the ancient Mediterranean world and none of these elements can be found in the parable.

Only to the first hired does the owner promise "the usual daily wage." They agree to accept it. To the second (and presumably all subsequent groups), the owner says: "I will pay you whatever is right."

At the end of the day, the owner pays the workers beginning with the last hired. This is an important narrative point without which the story would collapse because those hired first would have no reason to hang around if they were paid first. This point also indicated to ancient Mediterranean peoples that the owner wears two hats: he is an employer but can also be a patron.

A patron is a person of means who freely chooses to treat other people (always of lower status) "as if" they were family members. No one can bid for or "earn" such treatment, but everyone in the Mediterranean world of antiquity and the present seeks to have a patron.

The vineyard owner treats the last hired generously and graciously, "as if" they were relatives. They did nothing to "earn" such treatment. The owner gave them "what is right" for relatives. At the same time, the owner treats the first hired in accord with their agreement. If he chose to, the owner could disregard the agreement and treat the first hired generously, "as if" they were relatives. But he doesn't so choose. To the first hired, the vineyard owner chooses to be employer; to the last hired, the vineyard owner chooses to be a patron.

Jesus' lesson is not about economics but about God from a Middle Eastern perspective. Insinuated in Jesus' explanation is that God's choice for treating people may reflect how people deal with God. Such ideas clash with American economic ideas of equal opportunity, contracts, seniority, and the like. How would God behave from an American perspective?

BRING THE GOSPEL HOME SEP 20 2020

READING I: Isaiah 55:6-9

PSALM: 119:57, 72, 76-77, 127-130

READING II: Philippians 1:20-27

GOSPEL: Matthew 20:1-16a

Question for Children: How do you experience God being generous to you: through your family, friends, school, or parish?

Question for Youth: This Gospel reminds us that God is always seeking us out and welcoming us into his generous love. Through whom has God reached out to you? Who is always encouraging you to say "yes" to God?

Question for Adults: Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words how God will treat those who come to be part of the church, even those who come late.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist

Matthew was probably born in Galilee and was a publican tax collector at Capernaum at the time that Jesus called him. While a tax collector was a rich man, he was no more admired in ancient times than an IRS agent is admired today. The fact that Jesus chose a tax collector as a disciple shows us that he was bringing the Good News not just to the Pharisees and other self-righteous Jews, but also to the rejected people of society. Matthew was one of the twelve Apostles, and the second Gospel is attributed to him. According to Tradition, Matthew preached in Judea and then went to the East and to Ethiopia, where he suffered martyrdom according to the Roman Martyrology.


Matthew's message today: Matthew, probably the best educated of the Apostles, builds a logical case for Jesus as the Messiah to the Jewish people. In writing this Gospel, he shows a broad knowledge of what we today call the Old Testament. We all need to develop a familiarity with the Scripture if we are to understand the basics of our faith.
