BREAKING NEWS: Holy Trinity Catholic School is the **ONLY** school in Des Moines and 1 of only 18 in Iowa to be awarded “Model Professional Learning Community” status. One of about 200 Schools and Districts in the US and Canada receive this honor. Holy Trinity was recently recognized by Solution Tree for its sustained success in raising student achievement. HT’s successful implementation of the Professional Learning Communities at Work® process was a major contributing factor in the improved achievement of its students.

PLCs are schools and districts in which educators recognize the key to improved learning for students is on-going, job-embedded learning for the adults who serve those students. The three big ideas of a PLC call upon educators to:

1. Focus on learning.
2. Build a collaborative culture.
3. Create a results orientation.

The site was developed and is maintained by Solution Tree, a leading provider of educational strategies and tools that improve staff and student performance. For more than 20 years, Solution Tree resources have helped K–12 teachers and administrators create schools where all children succeed.

Haiti Disaster Relief

Dear Friends in Christ,


On August 14, 2021, Haiti suffered an earthquake that caused immense damage and substantial loss of life. The country is reeling from this natural disaster and the effects of the 2010 major earthquake. Tropical Storm Grace followed less than a week later, adding to a saga of devastation and destruction. I ask that you join me in my prayers of support for the people of Haiti and a response to their sufferings as a unified Church.

I am asking every faith community in our Diocese to take up a special collection over the weekend of August 28 and 29, 2021 for the humanitarian, long term recovery, and significant Church needs arising from these calamities. Contributions may be made to the Diocese of Des Moines General Disaster Relief Fund. Funds will be used in response to the earthquake and Tropical Storm Grace disasters in Haiti and other disasters that occur and will be distributed locally and globally where they are most needed.

Specifically, the Diocese of Des Moines will make a grant from contributions to this special appeal and the General Disaster Relief Fund to support the United States Conference of Catholic (USCCB) Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund. Funds are put towards pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church as well as the efforts of Catholic Relief Services and/or Catholic Charities USA. These agencies serve as the official relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church and respond to immediate emergency needs and aid in long-term rebuilding and recovery efforts.

NOTES ON THE MASS AUG 29 2021

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READING

The Heart of the Matter

The people in this week's [Gospel](#) are quarreling about who has and who hasn't washed his hands for dinner.

If you were a follower of the Jewish custom of that time, you would know that every person was required to wash up before eating. The rule was "a tradition of the elders," to preserve physical health, of course. But Jesus is now telling people they have to live also from the inner meaning of traditions and laws.

So, let us talk about the interior of traditions, rules and laws.

Children do not yet have a developed interior value system, as parents know.

"It is bedtime. Let's brush our teeth and get our pajamas on."

"I don't want to."

"I know, it is hard to stop playing and go to bed. I understand. But bedtime is here so let's get started."

"But why?"

"Because we have to get our rest so we can be bright and cheerful tomorrow."

"Why?"

"Because I said so, now get moving."

Rules, the right ones, must be imposed upon a child.

As we grow up, the child's "why?" question gets answered by experience and maturity. Adults go to bed because they need a certain amount of sleep each night and they know it. Well, at least a lot of us do.

But why have rules and laws in the first place? I have heard the following: rules are meant to describe the minimum that has to be done in order to belong to a country or state or city or business or group or family. Not too many rules, not too few.

This is difficult to achieve. Under the best circumstances, people follow rules because their allegiance comes from within and they act from their own desire.

Apply this to a group. Take a faith-sharing group, for instance. It has an implicit expectation, even a requirement, that its members be present at each weekly meeting. What if a person shows up only once or twice a year, but in that case, is the heart-and-soul of the discussion? And what if another person attends every single meeting but contributes nothing and in fact has no interest in the topics?

Neither person really fits well into the group, but which would you rather work with? The first has real relevance to the organization and might not need much convincing to come more often (and therefore comply better to the rule). But it would be much harder to kindle a fire in the second, wouldn't it, the one who is following the external rule but not its insides.

The interior life of Jesus *IS* the Holy Spirit of love. Jesus knew that any law of the Kingdom of God must emerge from love or else be empty. He was angry that Pharisees and Scribes had manipulated exterior laws to feed their own egos. "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."

He is not telling them to ignore the laws and have just inner devotion. He is saying you must have both, external plus internal adherence. Would it be worth it for you and me to look at the various obligations in our life and weigh how much correspondence they have to our inner values and convictions?

Maybe that would help us have the right heart both inside and outside.

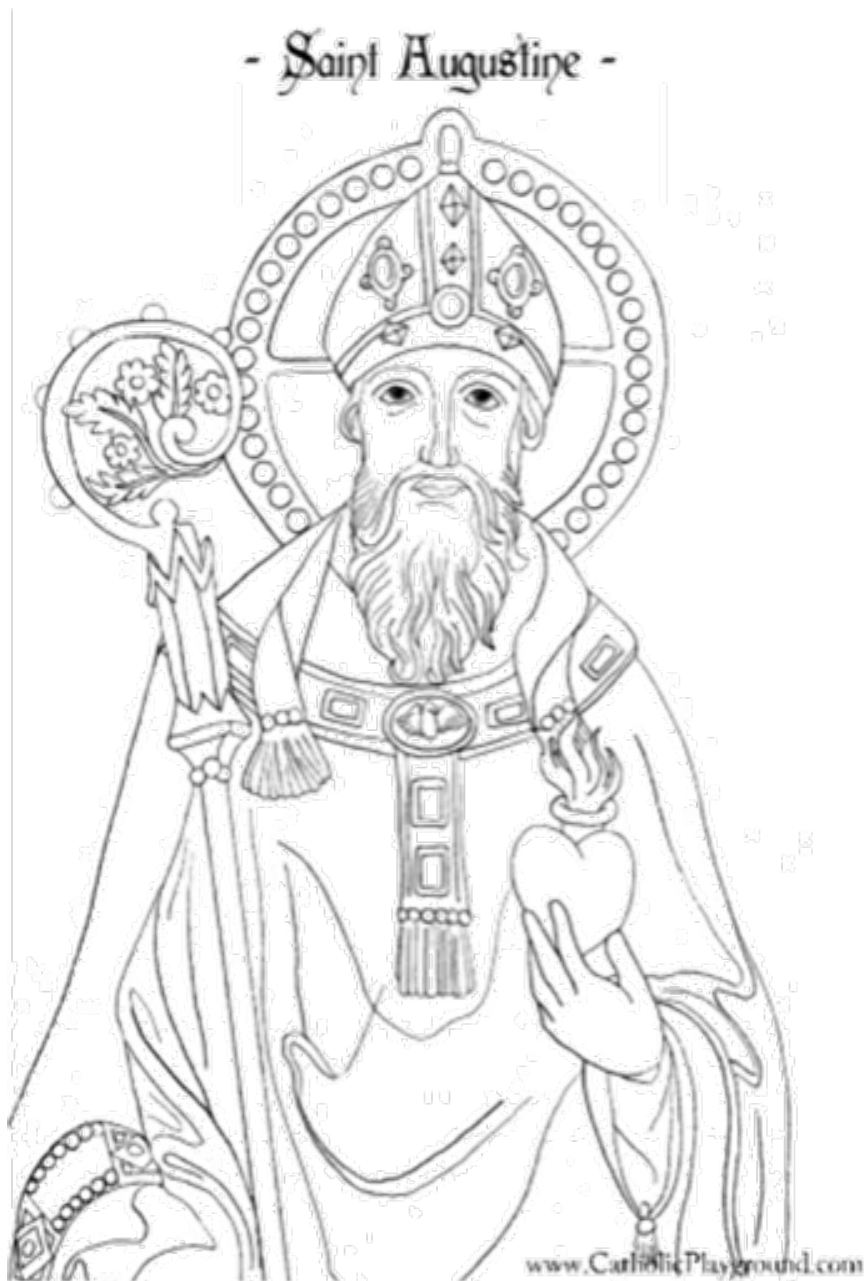
SAINT OF THE WEEK

Augustine, Bishop and Doctor

Augustine was the eldest son of St. Monica and Patricius, a pagan Roman official. As a young man, he studied at the university at Carthage with the intent of becoming a lawyer, but gave up law to devote himself to literary pursuits. Along the way, he abandoned his Christian faith. He eventually moved to Milan, where he was impressed by the sermons of St. Ambrose, the bishop of the city. His influence, as well as the prayers of his mother, brought him back to Christianity and he was baptized by Ambrose at the Easter Vigil in 387. Augustine became one of the greatest teachers and theologians of the church, and his works are studied widely yet today.

Augustine's message today: It took over thirty years for Augustine to recognize what God was calling him to do. When he accepted that call, he became one of the Church's greatest theologians. We all know people whose talents could be of great service to God if they were to acknowledge and embrace their calling. Are you one of these people?

Do you pray for those who might perform wonders if they turned their lives around? Or do you just dismiss these people?
