

FROM DIOCESE WORSHIP OFFICE

As you know, the flu season is once again upon us. Several inquiries have been made to the Diocesan Worship Office regarding practical questions of sanitation during Worship in the midst of flu season, and we would simply like to take the opportunity to remind everyone to use prudence and common sense during flu season. The appropriate use of hand sanitizer, along with other common sanitary practices, goes a long way towards helping prevent the spread of the virus. Eucharistic Ministers who are feeling unwell during flu season should, out of charity and prudence, find someone to take their place. Prudence is also encouraged during the sign of peace; as the priest or deacons' exhortation to the faithful says, "let us offer each other the sign of peace." This sign does not have to necessarily have to involve physical contact. When it comes to Holy Communion, this may be also a good time for a quick reminder to our people that one receives the fullness of the Sacrament from either of the sacred species, and charity might call one to forgo the chalice if feeling ill.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys

"God closes a door and then opens a window," people sometimes say when dealing with their own disappointment or someone else's. That was certainly true in Marguerite's case. Children from European as well as Native American backgrounds in 17th-century Canada benefited from her great zeal and unshakable trust in God's providence. Born the sixth of 12 children in Troyes, France, Marguerite at the age of 20 believed that she was called to religious life. Her applications to the Carmelites and Poor Clares were unsuccessful. A priest friend suggested that perhaps God had other plans for her. In 1654, the governor of the French settlement in Canada visited his sister, an Augustinian canoness in Troyes. Marguerite belonged to a sodality connected to that convent. The governor invited her to come to Canada and start a school in Ville-Marie (eventually the city of Montreal). When she arrived, the colony numbered 200 people with a hospital and a Jesuit mission chapel. Soon after starting a school, she realized her need for coworkers. The Congregation of Notre Dame was established in 1676. Marguerite also established a school for Indian girls in Montreal. At the age of 69, she walked from Montreal to Quebec in response to the bishop's request to establish a community of her sisters in that city. By the time she died, she was referred to as the "Mother of the Colony." Marguerite was canonized in 1982.

It's easy to become discouraged when plans that we think that God must endorse are frustrated. Marguerite was called not to be a cloistered nun but to be a foundress and an educator. God had not ignored her after all.

Children: What does God want you to do? To forgive? Be generous? To love?

Question for Youth: As you grow, how do you know what God wants you to do? How do you hear the voice of God saying, "you are one of mine, of my chosen?"

Question for

Adults: Today's readings lead to a core question: As you follow God and do what he wants, how do you experience his loving words: "You are my own. My favor is upon you."?
