What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: "Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one's] heart more specifically: do this, shun that" (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn't just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- Begin by being open to the truth and what is right.
- 2) Study Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church.
 3) Examine the facts and background
- information about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- Prayerfully reflect to discern the will of God (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- Seek the prudent advice and good example of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- Regularly partake in an examination of conscience to hear God's voice in your life 1

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. "Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil." 2

Here are some questions for further reflection:

- When has my conscience guided me to "do good and avoid evil"?
- 2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
- 3. Forming conscience is a "lifelong task." What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?

BRING THE GOSPEL HOME FEB 16 2020

READING I: Sirach 15:15-20

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

Question for Children: Which rules cause

you the most difficulty? Why?

Question for Youth: In your own words, describe what the spirit of God's law is.

Question for Adults: Have you considered that laws are made with love? Do you accept God's love through his laws?



Cyril, Monk, 825-869 & Methodius, Bishop, 826-884

Cyril and Methodius were brothers born at Thessalonika, Greece, of a senatorial family. Both brothers wanted to live out their lives in a monastery. In 861, however, Emperor Michael III sent them to convert the Khazars in Russia. The brothers learned the Khazar language and made many converts before returning to their monastery. In 863, Photius, now the patriarch of Constantinople sent the two brothers to Moravia, part of the Czech Republic, to convert the people. The brothers put their knowledge of the Slavonic language to good use. They invented an alphabet, based largely on Greek capital letters. (The Cyrillic alphabet attributed to Cyril was probably the work of his followers.) With the new alphabet, the brother began translating the liturgical books into Slavonic and began using the Slavonic tongue in their Church services. Because of this, and the fact that they were from Constantinople where heresy was abundant, they incurred the wrath of the German clergy and bishops.

Summoned to Rome in 869 to defend their positions, the brothers were received warmly by Pope Adrian II, who, convinced of their orthodoxy, approved their use of the Slavonic language in their liturgies and announced that they were to be consecrated bishops. But shortly after, Cyril died on February 14, 869. It is not known whether he ever was consecrated as a bishop. Methodius was consecrated, however, and returned to Moravia as bishop. He and Cyril are called the "Apostles of the Slavs" and to this day the liturgical language of the Russians, Serbs, Ukrainians, and Bulgars is that designed by Cyril and Methodius.

Cyril and Methodius' message today: These brothers recognized the needs of the people among whom they were working. Over a thousand years ago, Cyril and Methodius translated Scripture into their language and used the vernacular in their worship. Ministering to their people in this manner brought condemnation from others, but Cyril and Methodius persevered despite obstacles.

Do you defend those principles that you know are right when others condemn them? Do you spend time studying the background so that you can apply persuasive arguments to your defense or do you just base your stand on a "feeling?"
