GREETINGS

I have an update for the parish this week. As I write this, we are preparing for the fall garage sale. A big thanks to Gigi Wilwerding for coordinating this sale and for her army of volunteers! Thanks!

Our weekend public Masses continue to go well. Our numbers are slowly increasing and were as follows for August 1/2: Saturday 4:30, 51 people, Sunday 8:30 am, 80 people, and Sunday 10:30 am, 119 people. We do want to continue offering our normal schedule of Masses, but we are in need of more volunteers to serve as ushers. Please call the parish office if you are able to help.

We do ask that when you come to Mass, please do fill in from the front first, as this will help us to seat more people. I know this is not the normal procedure for many, but we are not in a normal time at present. Please also try to arrive at least ten minutes early. Thank you for your cooperation with new procedures. I know the distancing and masks are not convenient. The vast majority of those joining us are using masks (over 97% at present for weekends) -- Thank you! This is currently the best method we have to mitigate the spread of the virus and something I am asking you to do for one another. I was reminded of something Sr. Mary Clement used to tell us: "Your rights end where the other person's nose begins." I thought this seemed particularly appropriate at present as most people's noses (and mouths) are now covered by masks.

This item has unfortunately become somewhat of a political issue, when in reality it is an issue of consideration for others and not placing others at unnecessary risk. Thank you again for your cooperation.

An update on the annual appeal: At present, we have 302 pledges for a total of \$105,235 in gifts and outstanding pledges We are getting there. Please keep the pledges coming. Thank you so much to all those who have made such generous pledges thus far. If you have not yet had a chance to make a pledge or gift, please give this your most prayerful consideration. We do need your help. Thank you again for your continued support of Holy Trinity!



BRING THE GOSPEL HOME AUG 9 2020

READING I: 1 Kings 19-13

PSALM: 85:9-14

READING II: Romans 9:1-5

GOSPEL: Matthew 14:22-33

Question for Children: What does God's voice sound like when you pray and listen to Jesus?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr

It was Lawrence's job in his local Church community to handle the treasury, distribute alms to the poor, and take care of the sick, of which more than 1000 were under the care of the Church at this time. He set out to find all of the poor, the widows, the orphans, and all others cared for by the Church. He distributed to them all of the money which he had and even sold the chalices and other sacred vessels of the Church to support the poor. A Roman official assumed that Lawrence was very wealthy, so he demanded that the treasures of the Church be handed over to him. Lawrence promised that he would hand over these treasures, but needed time to assemble and inventory them. He was granted three days. On the third day, Lawrence had assembled hundreds of poor, the old, the lame, the blind, lepers, widows and orphans. Then, going to the Roman official, he presented these as the treasures of the Church. We sometimes have a tendency to take ourselves too seriously, and forget that God has the ultimate sense of humor. We too are blessed with this gift, and should manage the sufferings which we experience with the best possible grace.

NOTES ON THE MASS AUG 9 2020

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READINGS

Walking on Water

In the Second Reading, Paul enumerates the many blessings God gave his people in the time of the Law and the Prophets: the adoption as children of God, covenants, commandments and an order of worship. They had God's promises, and the promise of glory was among them. But Paul makes the list of these blessings with great sorrow, as he says, because it is hard for him to see any of the promised good things in the current state of God's people.

It can certainly seem to a Christian as if the same list and the same sorrow are suitable for Christians now.

Christians are also promised adoption as children of God. They have a covenant, a new covenant, with God, and a new worship to go with it. They are promised glory too, the glory of holiness and union with the Lord.

But, for Christians now as for God's people then, it is often very difficult to see the fulfillment of these promises in one's own life. Does anyone have even one day in which he feels that his life has shown the fruit of these promises on that day?

So, for every Christian, there is a sorrow of the sort Paul expressed, because the sins and failures of one's life can seem so hard to square with the promises of God. Where is the adoption and the glory?

What are God's people to do in this condition and its sorrow? The Gospel gives us a picture for an answer: as long as he has faith and doesn't look down, Peter comes to the Lord, walking on water.

No matter how sorrowful a person's failures, he can nonetheless come to the Lord. Doing so may feel like walking without any solid ground under foot. But faith is a kind of walking on water, too, isn't it? As long as one doesn't look down, as long as one keeps his eyes fixed on Jesus in faith, even walking on nothing in order to come to him is possible. All the promises of God are fulfilled in Him.

Stephen of Hungary, King

In 997, Stephen worked very hard to establish the Church in Hungary, receiving the title of King for himself. He encouraged the growth of the Church, working against pagan forces to do so. He was a just King who governed by law based on Christian principles. Although meant to improve living conditions for all people, it made enemies for Stephen among those who were less fervent Christians. Nevertheless, Stephen was successful in bringing the local tribes together as one people and establishing the independent kingdom of Hungary.

Stephen, a ruler with all the power and wealth in his kingdom at his disposal, recognized that he had obligations reaching far beyond governing his people and used Christian principles to create an environment of change. We too can use our Christianity to better the lives of those around us.
