Greetings.

In the Gospel today, we heard the Apostles say to Jesus, "Increase our faith!" Jesus then tells the parable of the mustard seed, telling them if they had the smallest amount of faith, nothing would be beyond them. Many of us have probably had this same thought; if only I had more faith...What were the disciples asking? What was Jesus trying to tell them? How does it apply to us today?

Increase our faith...what does this mean? First, we can ask, 'where does our faith come from?' For most of us, didn't it most likely begin with our parents; they raised us to believe faith was important. However, why is it important? Why was it important to our parents? What did it do for them? What does it mean for me today? Ponder and pray about these questions as you go through your week.

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4

The just one lives by faithfulness.

- The prophet Habakkuk, a contemporary of Jeremiah, preached during a time of great turmoil.
- Habakkuk questions why God tolerates violence against the innocent.
- God told the prophet that the faithful person must be patient and wait for God's promises.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Stir into flame the gift of God.

- The passage from the Second Letter of Paul to Timothy was an exhortation to Christian ministers to be faithful.
- When one accepts the call to ministry, one is gifted by the Spirit of God.
- The function of the Holy Spirit is to give strength and perseverance in a difficult job, which is a theme that points to the hardships that must be endured in the ministries of Paul and Timothy and their successors.

Gospel : Luke 17:5-10

Increase our faith.

- Today's Gospel passage is from a collection of Jesus' sayings on discipleship.
- The disciples ask Jesus for an increase of faith. With the exaggerated image of a mustard seed, Jesus casts doubt on their possession of any faith.
- In the second saying about workers, Jesus warns his followers against thinking that they deserve or can earn a special reward because of their service.


Reading I Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4 | **Psalm** 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 | **Reading II** 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 | **Gospel** Luke 17:5-10

Question For The Children Jesus teaches us that our faith is powerful and with it, we can do great things. We can forgive, love, and share with others. Which of these do you do most often?

Question For The Youth The Gospel tells us even a little bit of faith is enough to make amazing things happen. How are you keeping your faith alive and growing? What good things happen in your life because of your faith?

Question For The Adults Being "in Christ" means living as Christ teaches. What signs do you see in your life of generosity, forgiveness, hospitality, or any other of Jesus' teachings?

Activity Of The Week In the readings for Sunday, there is communication between God and the people involved in the story. In all cases, there is a plea for God to help and to give strength. Have your family reflect on one troubling situation about which they will pray to God for help. Use the prayer as an additional meal prayer or evening prayer.



Saint Of The Week Francis of Assisi

Born the son of a wealthy merchant, Francis spent his youth in extravagant living and pleasure-seeking. Although he lavishly spent his money, he was also generous. Francis never refused a beggar who asked for alms for the love of God. Stricken by a long and serious illness, which he bore with great patience, Francis recovered and for a while returned to his former way of life. But he found that he no longer had the heart for it. Francis had a vision of Christ who told him to "build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." He dedicated himself to serving the Church by calling it to simpler faith. His influence was widespread.

Francis of Assisi's message today:

This saint discovered the "selfish secret" which is made clear in his prayer, "It is in giving that we receive; in loving that we are loved...." Francis received much and was loved greatly, for he himself gave generously and loved abundantly.

Do you recognize that giving of your time reaps tremendous rewards? That loving the unloved will bring love back to you many times over?


